Product Description

The Ventrac KW350 weather cab is designed for the sole purpose of sheltering the operator from the weather while providing superior visibility. Standard features include a front windshield wiper, large left-side entry door, right-side emergency exit, door and side windows that can be quickly and easily removed, and a 4-point seatbelt.

Optional accessories include a strobe light, work lights, directional lights, defrost fan, and heater kits. Refer to your national and/or local regulations for lighting requirements specific to your intended application.

NOTE: The KW350 weather cab cannot be used with the Ventrac KH500 versa-loader or the Ventrac RV600 Collection Vacuum.

Why Do I Need an Operator's Manual?

This manual has been created to help you gain the important knowledge of what is needed to safely operate, maintain, and service your machine. It is divided into sections for convenient reference of the appropriate section.

You must read and understand the operator's manual for each piece of Ventrac equipment you own. Reading the operator's manual will help you become familiar with each specific piece of equipment. Understanding the operator's manual will help you, as well as others, avoid personal injury and/or damage to the equipment. Keep this manual with the machine at all times. The manual should remain with the machine even if it is sold. If this manual becomes damaged or unreadable, it should be replaced immediately. Contact your local Ventrac dealer for a replacement.

When using a Ventrac attachment, be sure to read and follow the safety and operating instructions of both the power unit and the attachment being used to ensure the safest operation possible.

The information in this manual provides the operator with the safest procedures to operate the machine while getting the maximum use out of the unit. Failure to follow the safety precautions listed in this manual may result in personal injury and/or damage to the equipment.

INTRODUCTION

Using Your Manual

Throughout this manual, you will encounter special messages and symbols that identify potential safety concerns to help you as well as others avoid personal injury or damage to the equipment.

SYMBOL DEFINITIONS



ATTENTION

This symbol identifies potential health and safety hazards. It marks safety precautions. Your safety and the safety of others is involved.

There are three signal words that describe the level of safety concern: Danger, Warning, and Caution. Safety should always be the #1 priority when working on or operating equipment. Accidents are more likely to occur when proper operating procedures are not followed or inexperienced operators are involved. Note: Right-Hand and Left-Hand orientations may be referred to at different places throughout this manual. Right-Hand and Left-Hand is determined as if sitting on the tractor seat facing forward.

SIGNAL WORD DEFINITIONS

A DANGER

Indicates an imminently hazardous situation which, if not avoided, will result in death or serious injury. This signal word is limited to the most extreme cases.

A WARNING

Indicates a potentially hazardous situation which, if not avoided, could result in death or serious injury.

A CAUTION

Indicates a potentially hazardous situation which, if not avoided, may result in minor or moderate injury and/or property damage. It may also be used to alert against unsafe practices.

Manual Glossary

Power Unit A Ventrac tractor or other Ventrac engine powered device that may be operated by itself or

with an attachment or accessory.

Attachment A piece of Ventrac equipment that requires a Power Unit for operation.

Accessory A device that attaches to a Power Unit or Attachment to extend its capabilities.

Machine Describes any "Attachment" or "Accessory" that is used in conjunction with a power unit.

SAFETY

Safety Decals

The following safety decals must be maintained on your KW350 weather cab.

Keep all safety decals legible. Remove all grease, dirt, and debris from safety decals and instructional labels. If any decals are faded, illegible, or missing, contact your dealer promptly for replacements. When new components are installed, be sure that current safety decals are affixed to the replacement components.



Training Required

- The owner of this machine is solely responsible for properly training the operators.
- The owner/operator is solely responsible for the operation of this machine and prevention of accidents or injuries occurring to him/herself, other people, or property.
- Do not allow operation or service by children or untrained personnel. Local regulations may restrict the age of the operator.
- Before operating this machine, read the operator's manual and understand its contents.
- If the operator of the machine cannot understand this manual, then it is the responsibility of this machine's owner to fully explain the material within this manual to the operator.
- Learn and understand the use of all controls.
- Know how to stop the power unit and all attachments quickly in the event of an emergency.

Personal Protective Equipment Requirements

It is the responsibility of the owner to be sure that the operators use the proper personal protective equipment while operating the machine. Required personal protective equipment includes, but is not limited to, the following list.



- Wear a certified ear protection device to prevent loss of hearing.
- Prevent eye injury by wearing safety glasses while operating the machine.
- Closed toe shoes must be worn at all times.
- Long pants must be worn at all times.
- When operating in dusty conditions, it is recommended that a dust mask be worn.

Operation Safety

- Inspect machine before operation. Repair or replace any damaged, worn, or missing parts. Be sure guards and shields are in proper working condition and are secured in place. Make all necessary adjustments before operating machine.
- Some pictures in this manual may show shields or covers opened or removed in order to clearly illustrate any instructions. Under no circumstance should the machine be operated without these devices in place.
- Alterations or modifications to this machine can reduce safety and could cause damage to the machine.
 Do not alter safety devices or operate with shields or covers removed.
- Before each use, verify that all controls function properly and inspect all safety devices. Do not operate if controls or safety devices are not in proper working condition.
- Check parking brake function before operating. Repair or adjust parking brake if necessary.
- Observe and follow all safety decals.
- All controls are to be operated from the operator's station only.
- Always wear a seat belt if the machine has a roll cage/bar installed and in upright position.
- Ensure the attachment or accessory is locked or fastened securely to the power unit before operating.
- Ensure that all bystanders are clear of the power unit and attachment before operating. Stop machine if someone enters your work area.
- Always be alert to what is happening around you, but do not lose focus on the task you are performing. Always look in the direction the machine is moving.
- Look behind and down before backing up to be sure of a clear path.
- If you hit an object, stop and inspect the machine. Make all necessary repairs before operating machine again.
- Stop operation immediately at any sign of equipment failure. An unusual noise can be a warning of equipment failure or a sign that maintenance is required. Make all necessary repairs before operating machine again.





Operation Safety (continued)

- If equipped with a high/low range feature, never shift between high and low range while on a slope. Always move the machine to level ground and engage the parking brake before shifting range.
- Do not leave machine unattended while it is running.
- · Always park the machine on level ground.
- Always shut off engine when connecting attachment drive belt to the power unit.
- Never leave the operator's station without lowering the attachment to the ground, setting the parking brake, shutting off the engine, and removing the ignition key. Make sure all moving parts have come to a complete stop before dismounting.
- Never leave equipment unattended without lowering the attachment to the ground, setting the parking brake, shutting off the engine, and removing the ignition key.
- · Only operate in well-lit conditions.
- Do not operate when there is a risk of lightning.
- Never direct the discharge of any attachment in the direction of people, buildings, animals, vehicles, or other objects of value.
- Never discharge material against a wall or obstruction. Material may ricochet back towards the operator.
- Use extra caution when approaching blind corners, shrubs, trees, or other objects that may obscure vision.
- Do not run the engine in a building without adequate ventilation.
- Do not touch the engine or the muffler while the engine is running or immediately after stopping the engine. These areas may be hot enough to cause a burn.
- Do not change the engine governor settings or over-speed the engine. Operating engine at excessive speed may increase the hazard of personal injury.
- To reduce the hazard of fire, keep the battery compartment, engine, and muffler areas free of grass, leaves, excessive grease, and other flammable materials.

Preventing Accidents



- Clear working area of objects that might be hit or thrown from machine.
- Keep people and pets out of working area.
- Know the work area well before operation. Do not operate where traction or stability is questionable.
- Reduce speed when you are operating over rough ground.
- Equipment can cause serious injury and/or death when improperly used.

Before operating, know and understand the operation and safety of the power unit and the attachment being used.

- Do not operate machine if you are not in good physical and mental health, if you will be distracted by personal devices, or are under the influence of any substance which might impair decision, dexterity, or judgment.
- Children are attracted to machine activity. Be aware of children and do not allow them in the working area. Turn off the machine if a child enters the work area.

Keep Riders Off

- Only allow the operator on the power unit. Keep riders off.
- · Never allow riders on any attachment or accessory.









Operating On Slopes

- Slopes can cause loss-of-control and tip-over accidents, which can result in severe injury or death. Be familiar with the emergency parking brake, along with the power unit controls and their functions.
- If power unit is equipped with a fold down roll bar, it must be locked in the upright position when operating on any slope.
- Use low range (if equipped) when operating on slopes greater than 15 degrees.




- Never shift between high and low range while on a slope. Always move the power unit to level ground and engage the parking brake before shifting range or placing the power unit in neutral.
- Variables such as wet surface and loose ground will reduce the degree of safety. Do not drive where
 machine could lose traction or tip over.
- Keep alert for hidden hazards in the terrain.
- Stay away from drop-offs, ditches, and embankments.
- Sharp turns should be avoided when operating on slopes.
- Pulling loads on hills decreases safety. It is the responsibility of the owner/operator to determine loads that can safely be controlled on slopes.
- Transport machine with attachment lowered or close to the ground to improve stability.
- While operating on slopes, drive in an up and down direction when possible. If turning is necessary while driving across slopes, reduce speed and turn slowly in the downhill direction.
- Assure a sufficient supply of fuel for continuous operation. A minimum of one-half tank of fuel is recommended.

Roadway Safety

- Operate with safety lights when operating on or near roadways.
- Obey all state and local laws concerning operation on roadways.
- Slow down and be careful of traffic when operating near or crossing roadways. Stop before crossing roads or sidewalks. Use care when approaching areas or objects that may obscure vision.
- If there is doubt of safety conditions, discontinue machine operation until a time when operation can be performed safely.
- When operating near or on roadways, have a Slow Moving Vehicle Emblem clearly displayed.

Truck Or Trailer Transport

- Use care when loading or unloading machine into a truck or trailer.
- Use full width ramps for loading machine into a truck or trailer.
- The parking brake is not sufficient to lock the machine during transport. Always secure the power unit and/or attachment to the transporting vehicle securely using straps, chains, cable, or ropes. Both front and rear straps should be directed down and outward from the machine.
- Shut off fuel supply to power unit during transport on truck or trailer.
- If equipped, turn the battery disconnect switch to the Off position to shut off electrical power.







Maintenance

- Keep all safety decals legible. Remove all grease dirt, and debris from safety decals and instructional labels.
- If any decals are faded, illegible, or missing, contact your dealer promptly for replacements.
- When new components are installed, be sure that current safety decals are affixed to the replacement components.
- If any component requires replacement, use only original Ventrac replacement parts.
- Always turn the battery disconnect to the Off position or disconnect the battery before performing any
 repairs. Disconnect the negative terminal first and the positive terminal last. Reconnect the positive
 terminal first and the negative terminal last.
- Keep all bolts, nuts, screws, and other fasteners properly tightened.
- Always lower the attachment to the ground, engage parking brake, shut off engine, and remove the
 ignition key. Make sure all moving parts have come to a complete stop before cleaning, inspection,
 adjusting or repairing.
- If the power unit, attachment, or accessory requires repairs or adjustments not instructed in the operator's manual, the power unit, attachment, or accessory must be taken to an authorized Ventrac dealer for service.
- Never perform maintenance on the power unit and/or attachment if someone is in the operator's station.
- Always use protective glasses when handling the battery.
- Check all fuel lines for tightness and wear on a regular basis. Tighten or repair them as needed.
- To reduce the hazard of fire, keep the battery compartment, engine, and muffler areas free of grass, leaves, and excessive grease.
- Do not touch the engine, the muffler, or other exhaust components while the engine is running or immediately after stopping the engine. These areas may be hot enough to cause a burn.
- Allow the engine to cool before storing and do not store near an open flame.
- Do not change the engine governor settings or over-speed the engine. Operating engine at excessive speed may increase the hazard of personal injury.
- Springs may contain stored energy. Use caution when disengaging or removing springs and/or spring loaded components.
- An obstruction or blockage in a drive system or moving/rotating parts may cause a buildup of stored energy. When the obstruction or blockage is removed, the drive system or moving/rotating parts may move suddenly. Do not attempt to remove an obstruction or blockage with your hands. Keep hands, feet, and clothing away from all power-driven parts.
- Dispose of all fluids in accordance with local laws.

Fuel Safety



- To avoid personal injury or property damage, use extreme care in handling gasoline. Gasoline is extremely flammable and the vapors are explosive.
- Do not refuel machine while smoking or at a location near flames or sparks.
- Always refuel the machine outdoors.
- Do not store machine or fuel container indoors where fumes or fuel can reach an open flame, spark, or pilot light.
- Only store fuel in an approved container. Keep out of reach of children.
- Never fill containers inside a vehicle or on a truck or trailer bed with a plastic liner. Always place containers on the ground away from your vehicle before filling.
- Remove machine from the truck or trailer and refuel it on the ground. If this is not possible, refuel the machine using a portable container, rather than from a fuel dispenser nozzle.
- Never remove fuel cap or add fuel with the engine running. Allow engine to cool before refueling.
- Never remove fuel cap while on a slope. Only remove when parked on a level surface.
- Replace all fuel tank and container caps securely.





Fuel Safety (continued)


- Do not overfill fuel tank. Only fill to bottom of fuel neck, do not fill fuel neck full. Overfilling of fuel tank could result in engine flooding, fuel leakage from the tank, and/or damage to the emissions control system.
- If fuel is spilled, do not attempt to start the engine. Move the power unit away from the fuel spill and avoid creating any source of ignition until fuel vapors have dissipated.
- If the fuel tank must be drained, it should be drained outdoors into an approved container.
- Dispose of all fluids in accordance with local laws.
- Check all fuel lines for tightness and wear on a regular basis. Tighten or repair them as needed.
- The fuel system is equipped with a shut-off valve. Shut off the fuel when transporting the machine to and from the job, when parking the machine indoors, or when servicing the fuel system.

Hydraulic Safety

- Make sure all hydraulic connections are tight and all hydraulic hoses and tubes are in good condition. Repair any leaks and replace any damaged or deteriorated hoses or tubes before starting the machine.
- Hydraulic leaks can occur under high pressure. Hydraulic leaks require special care and attention.
- Use a piece of cardboard and a magnifying glass to locate suspected hydraulic leaks.



Keep body and hands away from pinhole leaks or nozzles that eject high pressure hydraulic fluid. Hydraulic fluid escaping under high pressure can penetrate the skin causing serious injury, leading to severe complications and/or secondary infections if left untreated. If hydraulic fluid is injected into the skin, seek immediate medical attention no matter how minor the injury appears.



- Hydraulic system may contain stored energy. Before performing maintenance or repairs on the hydraulic system, remove attachments, engage parking brake, disengage weight transfer system (if equipped), shut off engine, and remove ignition key. To relieve pressure on the auxiliary hydraulic system, shut off the power unit engine and move the hydraulic control lever left and right before disconnecting the auxiliary hydraulic quick couplers.
- Dispose of all fluids in accordance with local laws.






KW350 Safety Procedures



- The cab door must be closed and latched during operation of power unit and KW350 weather cab.
- Window latches must be locked in either the closed or open position during operation of power unit and KW350 weather cab.
- Do not place any part of your body outside of the cab (through windows, door, or any other opening) during operation of power unit and KW350 weather cab.
- Do not place hands or fingers between power unit dash and cab front frame cross member. Pinch points may be created by the oscillation of the power unit front frame.
- Always wear the 4-point seatbelt when operating a power unit and KW350 weather cab. The seatbelt must be adjusted to fit individual operators.
- Do not operate power unit and KW350 weather cab without the headrest cushion in place.
- Do not operate power unit and KW350 weather cab on slopes greater than 10 degrees.
- The KW350 weather cab is equipped with an emergency exit (the right side front window). Learn to use the emergency exit prior to operating the power unit and KW350 weather cab. Refer to General Operation section of this manual for instructions on using the emergency exit.
- To prevent damage to the power unit engine, remove the lower dash cover and replace the solid pump cover with the original vented pump cover when outside air temperature is 50° F (10° C) or above.
- The power unit's steering cylinder must be installed in the outer position when equipped with a KW350 weather cab. Damage to the power unit and/or the weather cab will occur if the steering cylinder is installed in the center or inner positions. Refer to Setup section for steering cylinder mounting instructions.
- If the power unit is equipped with a diesel engine (models 4226 and 4231TD), the diesel fuel filter on the left side of the front frame must be relocated to prevent damage to the power unit and/or the weather cab. Refer to Setup section for relocation instructions.

Setup Instructions for Power Unit & Weather Cab

A WARNING

Before making repairs or adjustment, set the parking brake, turn off engine, and remove ignition key. Always disconnect the negative battery cable from the battery when working with electrical components. Always work in a manner that does not put safety at risk!

A WARNING

Safety glasses must be worn during installation. Ear (hearing) protection must be worn when using air or power tools.

A WARNING

Use only the KW350 lift sling attached at all four lift points to lift the cab.

Never walk or stand beneath cab when it is raised off the ground.


▲ WARNING

Place wheel chocks in front and back of wheels to prevent power unit from rolling during setup of power unit and weather cab.

Unless specified otherwise, use the bolt torque specifications listed below for all bolts used during setup and installation of the weather cab.

- 1. Place wheel chocks in front and back of wheels to prevent power unit from rolling.
- 2. If power unit is equipped with an optional strobe/ rear work light kit, it must be removed from the roll bar.
- 3. Install the power unit's steering cylinder in the outer position.



A CAUTION


Failure to install the power unit's steering cylinder in the outer position will result in damage to the power unit and/or weather cab.

4. If the power unit is equipped with a diesel engine (models 4226 and 4231TD), the diesel fuel filter on the left side of the front frame must be relocated.

A CAUTION

Failure to relocate the diesel fuel filter will result in damage to the power unit and/or weather cab.

Remove the fuel filter from the side of the power unit frame. If the power unit is not equipped with a second set of mounting holes approximately 2" below the original mounting holes, these holes will need to be drilled into the frame. Measure down 2 inches (5.1 cm) from the center of the hole following the angle of the frame edge. Measure in 3/8 inch (.95 cm) from the edge of the frame.



Place a block of wood between the frame and the radiator and drill a 9/32" (7.1 mm) hole at the

intersection of the measurement.

Measure 1-3/8" (3.5 cm) straight to the right of the first hole and drill a second hole. The second hole must be level with the first hole.

Remove the block of wood and any metal shavings. Use red touch up paint on the drilled holes. Install the fuel filter in the new set of holes using the provided 1/4 x 1" flange bolts and nuts. Install provided 1/4 x 5/8" smooth flange bolts in the original filter holes. Install the cushioned clamp that holds the fuel line in its original location. Ensure the fuel line from the fuel filter to the injection pump is free of contact with other parts.

5. Remove the right and left foot pegs from the power unit front frame. Reinstall bolts and tighten.




6. Disconnect the negative battery cable from the power unit's battery.

Remove the ground bolt located just behind the battery and replace it with the supplied 1/4 x 1" flange bolt inserted in the opposite direction. Reinstall the ground wires and flange nut. Install the 2) weather cab ground wires and fasten with the included flange nut.



Remove the bolts that fasten the battery box panel to the seat box frame and install the relay bracket.



(If the power unit is equipped with a relay bracket, the cab relay should be added to the existing relay bracket).

Attach the red fused wire to terminal 30 on the relay. Attach the red weather cab lead to terminal 87. Attach the lighter gauge black ground wire to terminal 85. Attach the gray wire to terminal 86, then connect to the existing gray wire on the power unit.

Install the relay onto the relay bracket using a 10-32 x 3/8 screw and flange nut.



Connect the red fused wire from the relay to the 12 volt lead from the power unit battery. Reconnect the negative battery cable.

7. Remove the pump cover from the power unit.
Fasten the left column cover to the power unit with one bolt. Press the column cover against the dash panel and mark the column cover hole location on the dash panel. Remove the left column cover.



Drill a 13/32" (10.2 mm) hole at the marked loca- 9. Fasten the pump cover tion and remove any metal shavings. Use touch up paint on exposed metal. Install u-nut into hole through dash vent.






Repeat for right column cover.

Loosen the top bolt on both the right and left sides of the lower dash panel and remove the bottom bolt on the right side of the lower dash panel as shown below.







Slide the tabs on the center column cover under the loosened bolts and reinstall the bottom bolt.

Tighten the top bolts.




Install the provided 1/4 x 1" flange bolt through the lower hole of the column cover and the lower hole of the pump cover.

Install the right column cover and tighten all column cover and pump cover bolts.

10. Install the front cab mounts to the foot platform of the power unit's lower rear tunnel frame.



Use 4) 5/16 x 3/4" bolts and 5/16" flat washers inserted through the front cab mounts and the lower rear frame and fasten with 5/16" flange nuts.

11. Serial number AA1039 and higher: install the rear frame insulation under the power unit seat, making sure the seat springs and the forward/reverse lever lock arm stick up through the insulation to make contact with the seat plate.

12. Remove the bottom bolt from both of the seat pivot mounts as shown.



Install the rear foot covers as shown. The right foot cover has a beveled flange at the bottom. Push the covers down against the foot platform and fasten with the original hardware.



13. Remove the existing seatbelt from the power unit. Install the seatbelt upper mount to the back edge of the roll bar as shown below. Install 2) U-bolts from the front of the roll bar through the holes in the seatbelt upper mount.



Center the seatbelt upper mount on the top of the roll bar and fasten with 4) 3/8" locking flange nuts. Make sure there are no twists in the seatbelt and fasten the lower seatbelt anchors to the power unit's seat box frame. Install a 7/16 x 1-1/4" bolt

and 7/16" flat washer through each seatbelt anchor. Add 2) 7/16" flat washers between each seatbelt anchor and the seat box frame. Fasten to the seat box frame with a 7/16" flat washer and a 7/16 lock nut. Note: The 4-point seatbelt does not connect to the "fasten seatbelt" indicator light circuit.




14. Install the lower rear window mount on the underside of the seat box rear flange. The window mount flange with snap studs should be angled up.




Install 5) 5/16 x 3/4" bolts and 5/16" flat washers down through seat box and fasten with 5/16" flange nuts.

15. Identify the left and right rear cab mounts. The cab mounting surface will be angled toward the front and the upper hole on the roll bar mount will also be toward the front.



Install the rear cab mounts onto the roll bar using 2) U-bolts and 3/8" locking flange nuts. The bottom face of the mounting flange should be parallel to the top face of the seat box plate and just above the weld seam on the roll bar.



Install a two piece isolator in the mounting hole of



17. Remove the gas door shock where it attaches to the cab frame. Insert a flat screwdriver under the spring clip and pry down to release.



Remove the shock end from the mounting stud. Remove the door from the cab by lifting the door off the hinge pins.

18. Remove the right front window (emergency exit). Lift up on the handle to unlatch. Push the window open slightly and lower the handle so the latch pin exits through the release slot.



Remove the window from the cab by lifting the window off the hinge pins.

19. Remove the right and left rear windows. Lift up on the handle to unlatch and push to open window. Pull the handle toward the rear of the cab until it can be removed from the latch pin.



Remove the rear windows from the cab by lifting the windows off the hinge pins.

- 20. Remove the fuel tank cover from the cab.
- 21. Attach lift sling to a hoist and position above the weather cab.

Clip the 4) lift sling hooks to the lift points at each corner of the cab.



Lift point decals are located under each lift point for easy identification.

Lift the weather cab and position it over the power unit.

A WARNING

Use only the KW350 lift sling attached at all four lift points to lift the cab.

Never walk or stand beneath cab when it is raised off the ground.



Lower the cab onto the power unit.
Insert a 1/2 x 3-1/2" bolt and 1/2" flat washer into the cab mount brackets and guide into the rear cab mount isolators.
Raise or lower the weather cab until the front cab supports align with the cab mounting



holes (cab supports mount on the inside). Install 4) 1/4 x 1-1/4" step bolts and fasten with 1/4" flange nuts. Do not tighten.



Lower the weather cab until the rear cab mount brackets are resting on the rear cab mount isolators.

Install a 3/16" thick, notched washer, a 1/2" flat washer, and a 1/2" nylon lock nut on the bottom side of each cab mount isolator.



Tighten the hardware for the front cab support to the cab, the front cab support to the cab front mounts, and the cab to the cab rear mounts.

22. Install the fuel tank cover by sliding the flanges down over the mounting flanges on the cab. Press the fuel tank cover down far enough to seal against the top of the fuel tank.

Install 2) 1/4 x 5/8" flange bolts into the 1/4" U-nuts on the back flange.



Install 2) $1/4 \times 5/8$ " flange bolts through the front flange and fasten with 1/4" flange nuts.

23. Install the door onto the cab by placing the hinge pivots over the hinge pins on the cab.



Align the gas door shock end with the mounting stud on the cab frame and press until shock end

snaps over the head of the mounting stud.

A CAUTION

The gas door shock must be installed to prevent the door from opening too far or swinging open or shut too fast.

Damage to the door glass and/or weather cab glass may occur if gas door shock is not installed.



Install the right lower window and right lower window bracket. Remove the nuts from the 4) step bolts installed in the window. Do not remove the spacers. Insert the bolts into the 3) mounting tabs on the cab frame. Install the right lower window bracket on the 3) rear step bolts and fasten



4) places with 1/4" flange nuts. Tighten only until rubber washer under the step bolt head begins to bulge slightly.

24. Install the lower door window support to the door frame with 2) 5/16 x 3/4" bolts and 5/16" flat washers. Fasten with 2) 5/16" flat washers and 5/16" lock nuts. Tighten until snug but support can still be moved.



Install the lower door window and the lower

door window bracket. Remove the nuts from the 4) step bolts installed in the window. Do not remove the spacers.


Insert the bolts into the two mounting tabs on the door frame and the mounting hole on the lower door window support. Install a 1/4" flange nut on the top front bolt to hold the window in place. Install the lower door window bracket on 3) rear step bolts and fasten with 1/4" flange nuts. Tighten all 4) flange nuts only until rubber washer under the step bolt



head begins to bulge slightly.

Shut the cab door and check the seal of the lower window to the power unit and weather cab. Move the bottom of the lower door window support in or out until window seals properly. Tighten the 5/16 x 3/4" bolts at the top of the lower door window support. Note: If door latch adjustment is required, refer to the service section of this manual.

25. Lay out the canvas bellows with the corner notch facing up and at the bottom of the bellows. If the notch is open to the right the bellows mounts on the left side of the cab. If the notch is open to the left the bellows mounts on the right side of the cab.



Install a bellows support strap through both the top and bottom sets of holes on the left and right canvas bellows.

Hook the bellows support straps to the left and right cab front supports and column covers.



Fasten the velcro strips on the canvas bellows to the velcro strips on the left and right cab front supports and column covers.

26. Install a column access cover over the high/low range selector and the PTO belt tensioner. The column access covers fasten to the column parts using velcro.





- 27. Install 2) 8" pieces of velcro loop to the rear of the roll bar, on both the left and right posts. Place the top of the velcro directly below the U-bolt for the rear cab mount.
- 28. Install the 1/2" wire clamp to the inside of the fuel tank cover on the power unit about 1-1/2" below the seatbelt mount.






Fasten the power lead wire loom in the clamp and connect the positive and negative leads from the weather cab to the power unit.

Tuck the wires down beside the relay bracket.

29. Snap the lower rear canvas window into place on the weather cab frame and the lower rear window mount.



Attach the velcro strips on the ends of the window to the velcro strips on weather cab frame.



30. Serial number AA1039 and higher: install the dash insulation between the upper and lower dash panels on the power unit.




31. Install the right front window and the left and right rear side windows by placing the hinge pivots on the window with the hinge pins on the weather cab.

Place the latches over the latch pins and push down to latch window.

Installation is complete. For weather cab removal instructions, refer to Preparing the Weather Cab for Storage in the Service section of this manual.

OPERATIONAL CONTROLS

Outer Door Handle & Lock (A)

Push the button on the outer door handle to unlatch the door. The outer door handle can be locked with a key. Turn the key clockwise to lock and counterclockwise to unlock the door.

Inner Door Handle (B)

Squeeze the button on the inner door handle to unlatch the door. The door cannot be locked from the inside

Emergency Exit/Window Latch Handle (C)

The emergency exit/window latch handle contains two channels for the latch pin. The lower channel allows the window to open and latch in place. The upper channel releases the handle from the latch pin and allows the window to swing completely out of the way to provide an emergency exit from the weather cab.

Rear Side Window Latch (D)

The rear left and right side window can both be opened and latched in place. When the window is open, the latch handle can be pulled back and removed from the latch pin to allow the window to be removed from the weather cab.

Fan Speed Switch (E)

Optional accessory. The heater fan speed switch has four positions to adjust the speed of the heater blower fan.

Temperature Control Dial (F)

Optional accessory. The temperature control dial controls the heat output of the heater.

Windshield Wiper Switch (G)

Pressing the top portion of the windshield wiper switch turns on the windshield wiper. Pressing the bottom portion of the switch turns the wiper off. Pressing and holding the bottom portion of the switch will cycle the windshield wiper until the switch is released. When the wiper is turned off, the wiper arm will return to the end of the stroke.

Front Work Light Switch (H)

Optional accessory. Pressing the top portion of the front work light switch turns the front work lights on. Pressing the bottom portion of the switch turns the lights off.

Rear Work Light Switch (I)

Optional accessory. Pressing the top portion of the rear work light switch turns the rear work light on. Pressing the bottom portion of the switch turns the light off.

Strobe Beacon Switch (J)

Optional accessory. Pressing the left portion of the strobe beacon switch turns the strobe beacon on. Pressing the right portion of the switch turns the strobe beacon off.

Hazard Flasher Light Switch (K)

Optional accessory. Pressing the right portion of the hazard flasher light switch flashes all four of the directional turn signal lights. Pressing the left portion of the switch turns the hazard flasher lights off.

Direction Turn Signal Switch (L)

Optional accessory. Pressing the left portion of the turn signal switch turns on the left turn signal. Pressing the right portion of the turn signal switch turns on the right turn signal. Return the switch to the middle position to turn off the signals. The left and right turn signals will override the hazard flashers.

Interior Light & Switch (M)

The switch on the light base turns the light on and off. The light swivels in the socket, which allows the light to be directed where needed.

Defrost Fan & Switch (N)

Optional accessory. The defrost fan has two speeds. Pressing the top portion of the switch turns the fan on low. Pressing the bottom portion of the switch turns the fan on high. Return the switch to the middle position to turn the fan off. The fan can be turned to direct the air where needed.

Directional Heat Vents (O)

Optional accessory. The heat vents can be rotated and the louvers can be tilted to direct air flow in the desired direction.

Do not rotate the vents by the louvers. Use the grip ribs on the vent flange for rotating the vents.

GENERAL OPERATION

Daily Inspection


A WARNING

Always set the parking brake, shut off power unit engine, remove the ignition key, and ensure all moving parts have come to a complete stop before inspecting components or attempting any repair or adjustment.

- 1. Park machine on a level surface, with the engine shut off and all fluids cold.
- Perform a visual inspection of both the power unit and the weather cab. Ensure the weather cab is properly mounted to the power unit. Look for loose or missing hardware, damaged components, or signs of wear.
- 3. Check the power unit's lights along with work lights, blinker lights, and/or strobe beacon to ensure lights are working properly.
- 4. Inspect window and door seals for cracks and tears. Check glass for chips or damage.
- 5. Inspect hydraulic hoses and fittings, fuel lines, and heater lines to ensure tight, leak free connections.
- Refer to the power unit operator's manual.
 Check the power unit's engine oil, hydraulic oil, cooling system, tire pressure, and fuel level. Add fluids or service as required.
- 7. Repair or replace damaged or non-working components.
- 8. Test the power unit's operator safety interlock system*.

4-Point Seatbelt

Fasten the lower buckle of the 4-point seatbelt and adjust the lap belt until snug but not tight. Tighten by pulling on the ends of the lap belt straps. Tighten both sides evenly so the buckle remains centered on the operator. Loosen by pulling up on the edge of the seatbelt strap lock facing away from the buckle.




Fasten the upper buckle of the 4-point seatbelt and adjust the left and right shoulder belts. The shoulder belts must be loose enough to allow the operator to reach all dash controls, but should be snug at the point that the operator can reach the dash controls. Tighten the left and right shoulder belts by pulling on the ends of the straps. Loosen the shoulder belts by lifting up on the tab on the seatbelt strap lock.

Adjust the upper buckle location, so that the buckle catches the operator in the middle of the chest when the operator leans forward against the belt.

If the seatbelt can not be tightened or loosened far enough to properly fit the operator, the seatbelt upper mount will need to be adjusted. Refer to seatbelt upper mount adjustment in the service section of this manual.

Strobe Beacon

The strobe beacon is mounted on an arm with two positions. The strobe beacon arm is rotated up for use, but can be rotated down for low clearance areas, transport, and storage. A hair pin secures the arm in the desired position.

If any component requires replacement, use only original Ventrac replacement parts.

Cleaning & General Maintenance

For best results, and to maintain the finish of the KW350, clean or wash the weather cab to remove dirt, gravel, and salt deposits. Remove any ice or snow accumulations from the roof, windows, and accessories.



Attention


To maintain the finish of the weather cab and accessories, thoroughly wash the equipment after each use to remove any corrosive agents (e.g., salt). Failure to clean the equipment may result in corrosion of (including but not limited to) steel, aluminum, and electrical components. Equipment that will experience repeated exposure to corrosive agents should be pretreated with a corrosion preventative.

Seatbelt Upper Mount Adjustment

The seatbelt upper mount has four seatbelt mounting positions. The seatbelt is mounted in the second position at the factory.

If the seatbelt cannot be tightened enough to properly secure the operator, move the seatbelt anchors to the first position on the seatbelt upper mount. If the seatbelt

cannot be loos-




ened enough to fit the operator, move the seatbelt anchors down to the third or fourth position on the seatbelt upper mount.

Window Latch Adjustment


The window latch pins can be adjusted if the windows do not close properly.

If the window does not seal correctly, loosen the nut on the window latch pin and move away from the window slightly.



Door Latch Adjustment

If the door does not latch properly, the latch pin can be adjusted. If the latch pin and door latch are misaligned vertically, loosen the nut on the back of the latch pin (A) and move the latch pin up or down until properly aligned with the door latch.



If the door does not latch because the latch pin is set too deep or if the door latches but does not seal properly, loosen the 2) latch plate bolts (B) and move the latch plate in or out to the proper depth. NOTE: Check the lower door window for proper adjustment prior to changing latch pin depth.


Lower Door Window Adjustment

Check the bottom of the lower door window where it meets the left cab front support.

If there is a gap between the lower door window and the cab front support when the main door is sealed, the lower door window needs to be adjusted inward. If the lower door window hits the cab front support too soon, it can prevent the cab door from latching or sealing properly. The lower door window needs to

Loosen the 2) bolts (A) at the top of the lower door window support (B). Move the bottom of the lower door window in or out until proper position is reached. Retighten the bolts on the lower door window support.

be adjusted outward.



Door Latch Lubrication

Lubricate the door latch mechanism every 50 hours with a spray lube or light weight oil. Use a cloth to protect the window glass from the spray and wipe off any excess oil to prevent dripping.


Wiper Blade Replacement

The wiper blade should be replaced on a yearly basis, or sooner if the blade does not clean the windshield effectively.

- 1. Remove the nut and bolt (A) that fasten the wiper blade to the wiper arm.
- 2. Install new wiper blade and reinstall the nut and bolt.

Interior Light Bulb Replacement

- Push in on the bulb (A) and turn counterclockwise to release.
- 2. Remove bulb from the light socket.




- 3. Align the pins on the new bulb with the slots in the light socket.
- 4. Push in on the bulb and turn clockwise.

Work Light Bulb Replacement


- Remove the 2) screws
 (A) from the work light cover and remove the cover.
- 2. Disconnect the positive wire (B) from the plug.
- Pinch the wire spring bulb fastener and lift away from the bulb.
- 4. Remove the defective light bulb.
- Install the new light bulb and secure with the wire spring bulb fastener.
- 6. Connect the positive wire to the plug.
- 7. Reinstall the headlight cover.






Turn Signal Bulb Replacement

- 5. Push in on the bulb and turn clockwise.


Strobe Beacon Bulb Replacement

High Voltage!

Before removing lens, turn off power and wait five minutes.

- 1. Turn the strobe beacon off and wait five minutes.
- 2. Unscrew the strobe lens (A) from the base.
- 3. Hold the circuit board (B) in place with one hand and remove the strobe bulb (C).






- Install the new strobe bulb. Push securely onto the circuit board connectors.
- Check to ensure the circuit board and the O-ring are in place, and reinstall the strobe lens.

Heater Air Filter Replacement

The 2) heater air intake filters should be replaced on a yearly basis, or sooner if operating in dusty conditions.

1. Remove the 2) thumb screws (A) holding each filter cover (B) onto the cab.



2. Remove both air filters (C) from the cab air intake vents and insert the replacement filters.



3. Reinstall the filter covers and thumb screws.

Warm Weather Operation

A CAUTION

Avoid Engine Damage!

The center column cover must be removed and the solid pump cover must be replaced with the vented pump cover when operating power unit equipped with weather cab in air temperatures of 50° F (10° C) or above.



Fuse Replacement

The fuse block is located in the headliner just in front of the right control panel.

1. Remove the 2) thumb screws (A) from the fuse block cover (B).



- 3. Push a new fuse into the socket.

A CAUTION

Always use the correct amperage fuse. If a fuse continuously burns out, it is a sign of a problem with the wires and/or the device being supplied power. Correct the problem before replacing the fuse.

Storage

Preparing the Weather Cab for Storage

1. Clean the weather cab.



Attention

To maintain the finish of the power unit and attachment, thoroughly wash the equipment to remove any corrosive agents (e.g., salt). Failure to clean the equipment may result in corrosion of (including but not limited to) steel, aluminum, and electrical components.

- 2. Inspect for loose or missing hardware, damaged components, or signs of wear.
- 3. Inspect safety decals, Replace any safety decals that are faded, illegible, or missing.

Removing the Weather Cab

A WARNING

Before making repairs or adjustment, set the parking brake, turn off engine, and remove ignition key. Always disconnect the negative battery cable from the battery when working with electrical components. Always work in a manner that does not put safety at risk!

A WARNING

Safety glasses must be worn during removal. Ear (hearing) protection must be worn when using air or power tools.

A WARNING

Use only the KW350 lift sling attached at all four lift points to lift the cab.

Never walk or stand beneath cab when it is raised off the ground.

A WARNING

Place wheel chocks in front and back of wheels to prevent power unit from rolling during removal of weather cab from the power unit.

- 1. Place wheel chocks in front and back of wheels to prevent power unit from rolling.
- 2. If the cab is equipped with spreader controls, remove and store with the spreader.

- 3. If the weather cab is equipped with a heater, locate the connection of the left cab heater hose and the power unit heater hose at the front edge of the power unit foot platform.
 - Pinch the hoses on each side of the connection to prevent loss of fluid. Disconnect the heater hoses and cap the ends with the fittings provided with the heater kit.
 - Repeat for right side heater hoses.
- Unsnap and remove the lower rear canvas window.
- Disconnect the electrical supply under the power unit seat at the left rear corner post. Unfasten the loom from the loom clamp on the fuel tank cover.
- 6. Remove the insulation from under the seat and from between the upper and lower dash.
- 7. Remove the column access cover from the high/low range selector and the PTO belt tensioner.
- 8. Unhook the 4) bellows support straps from the cab front supports and column covers. Remove the canvas bellows with the support straps from the weather cab.
- 9. Remove the cab door, the right front emergency window, and the left and right rear windows.
- 10. Remove the right lower window and window bracket from the weather cab.
- 11. Remove the gas tank cover from the weather cab.
- 12. Loosen the 1/2" bolts for the rear cab mounts and the 1/4" step bolts that fasten the main cab frame to the front cab supports.
- 13. Attach lift sling to a hoist and position above the weather cab.

Clip the 4) lift sling hooks to the lift points at each corner of the cab. Lift point decals are located under each lift point for easy identification. Lift the weather cab slightly and remove the 1/4" bolts from the cab front supports and the 1/2" bolts from the rear cab mounts.

Lift and remove the weather cab from the power unit and place on a pallet for storage.

A WARNING

Use only the KW350 lift sling attached at all four lift points to lift the cab.

Never walk or stand beneath cab when it is raised off the ground.

- 14. Remove the rear cab mounts from the power unit roll bar and store with the cab.
- 15. Loosen the 1/2" bolts that fasten the front cab supports to the front cab mounts, but do not

- remove. Remove the front cab mounts from the power unit foot platform and store with the cab.
- 16. Remove the lower dash cover, the right and left column covers, and the solid pump cover from the power unit center column.
- 17. Install the original vented pump cover.
- 18. Move the power unit steering cylinder to the middle mounting hole if using dual wheels or move to the inner hole for use with single wheels.
- 19. Reinstall the right and left foot pegs, if desired.
- 20. The 4-point seat belt may be left installed for use without the weather cab. If the 4-point seatbelt is removed from the power unit, the original lap belt must be reinstalled.
- 21. Place all cab components that were removed from the cab and power unit on the pallet inside the weather cab.
- 22. Reinstall the right emergency window and the right and left rear windows onto the cab.
- 23. Place the door inside the cab for storage, or remove the lower door window, window support, and lower door support bracket and place inside the cab and reinstall upper door onto the cab.
- 24. Secure the cab to the pallet and store at a location where it is unlikely to get damaged.

Removing the Weather Cab from Storage

Inspect, clean, and install the weather cab according to the setup instructions in this manual.



ILLUSTRATED DRAWING Electrical Diagram









LIMITED WARRANTY - VENTRAC TURF EQUIPMENT

Venture Products, Inc., (henceforth referred to as V.P.I.) warrants on the terms and conditions herein, that it will repair, replace, or adjust any part manufactured by Venture Products Inc., and found by Venture Products, Inc., to be defective in material and/or workmanship during the applicable warranty term.

All Ventrac commercial equipment purchased and registered on or after January 1, 2019 will carry a 2-year commercial warranty. The warranty period begins on the date of original customer purchase:

All Ventrac add-on kits and accessories such as: 3-point hitch, 12V front & rear power outlets, foot pedal, dual wheel kit, etc., will be covered under the above warranty periods provided they are installed by an Authorized Ventrac Dealer. This warranty may be transferred and will carry the remainder of the warranty starting from the original purchase/registration date with the dealership and/or V.P.I.

The engine warranty is covered by its respective engine manufacturer. Please refer to the engine manufacturer's warranty statement that is included in the owner's manual.

For warranty consideration on Ventrac commercial equipment, including any defective part, must be returned to an Authorized Ventrac Dealer within the warranty period. The warranty shall extend to the cost to repair or replace (as determined by V.P.I.) the defective part. The expense of pickup and delivery of equipment, service call drive time or any transportation expense incurred for warranty repair is the sole responsibility of the owner and is not covered under warranty by Ventrac and/or V.P.I. Ventrac and V.P.I.'s responsibility in respect to claims is limited to making the required repairs or replacements, and no claim of breach of warranty shall be cause for cancellation or rescission of the contract of sale of any Ventrac equipment. Proof of purchase may be required by the dealer to substantiate any warranty claim. Only warranty work performed and submitted by an Authorized Ventrac Dealer may be eligible for warranty credit.

This warranty extends only to Ventrac commercial equipment operated under normal conditions and properly serviced and maintained. The warranty expressly does NOT cover: (a) any defects, damage or deterioration due to normal use, wear and tear, or exposure; (b) normal maintenance services, such as cleaning, lubrication, oil change; (c) replacement of service items, such as oil, lubricants, spark plugs, belts, rubber hoses, bearings or other items subject to normal service replacement; (d) damage or defects arising out of, or relating to abuse, misuse, neglect, alteration, negligence or accident; (e) repair or replacement arising from operation of, or use of the equipment which is not in accordance with operating instructions as specified in the operator's manual or other operational instructions provided by V.P.I.; (f) repair or replacement arising as a result of any operation from Ventrac equipment that has been altered or modified so as to, in the determination of V.P.I., adversely affect the operation, performance or durability of the equipment or that has altered, modified or affected the equipment so as to change the intended use of the product; (g) repair or replacement necessitated by the use of parts, accessories or supplies, including gasoline, oil or lubricants, incompatible with the equipment or other than as recommended in the operator's manual or other operational instructions provided by V.P.I.; (h) repairs or replacements resulting from parts or accessories which have adversely affected the operation, performance or durability of the equipment; or (i) damage or defects due to or arising out of repair of Ventrac equipment by person or persons other than an authorized Ventrac service dealer or the installation of parts other than genuine Ventrac parts or Ventrac recommended parts.

No employee, distributor, or representative is authorized to change the foregoing warranties in any way or grant any other warranty on behalf of V.P.I.

Some states do not allow limitations on how long an implied warranty lasts or allow the exclusion on limitation of incidental or consequential damages, so the above limitation or exclusion may not apply to you.

This warranty gives you specific legal rights, and you may also have other rights which vary from state to state.

This warranty applies to all Ventrac commercial equipment sold by Venture Products Inc.
